
ARCHIVE





An archive is a collection of objects that say something about who a person was. It tells us about how people used to live, what they liked and about the time and place in which they grew up. If you had an archive what would you put in it?



You will need

- Pens or Pencils
- Glue
- Scissors

"We made our own boxes. We cut it with scissors and stuck it together. We put stuff about us in it."

ONE: Draw objects that say something about you in boxes A,B,C and D.



What do these things say about your life?

<u>TWO</u>: Using scissors, carefully cut out the template.



This will be your archive box.

<u>THREE</u>: Decorate your archive box any way you want. You might want to decorate the inside of the box too.



It's a special box with important things inside so think carefully about how it will look.

FOUR: Fold your box along the dotted lines, and use glue to connect the tabs.



Practice assembling the box without alue first.

FIVE: Fold up the 4 objects you drew and put them in your box.



Exchange your box with somebody else. Ask them about the objects they have treasured in their archive.
